



EHC Secures San Diego Energy Strategy to Benefit Low-Income Communities

On September 13, the San Diego City Council voted 7-0 to adopt a resolution that prioritizes low-income communities for energy retrofits and job creation as part of the City's long-term energy reduction strategy.

This resolution, which Environmental Health Coalition and our allies have fought for in recent months, means that the City will direct energy funds that it receives from the State and Federal governments to perform energy audits and retrofits on properties that can benefit the most.

This will help the City maximize energy savings by targeting older homes like the ones found in EHC communities.



The resolution also encourages companies doing energy retrofit work to hire qualified workers who live in local low-income communities with high unemployment and workers from local training centers like community colleges and apprentice programs whenever possible.
